ACCOMPLISHMENTS

We began **Fiscal Year 2020 – 2021** with all the challenges we faced in the previous fiscal year, due to COVID's new Delta variant. With the continuous fight against COVID, we were able to maintain our services by **"ADAPTING"** quickly to changes so our clients would not be affected in any way. This one word, **"ADAPT"** was our greatest accomplishment, and we are proud that our dedicated team adjusted effortlessly. We were able to hire four new employees; add three additional Life Skills classes (Anger Management, Parenting Education and 52-Week Child Abuser Treatment programs) in Spanish and convert all our Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence (DV/IPV) and Life Skills classes, as well as our Individual Counseling session virtually through Zoom.

We continued to provide Domestic Violence/Intimate Partner Violence (DV/IPV) Temporary Restraining Orders for free and we changed all our intake forms to electronic forms, which allows us to reduce more paper, as we are a certified Green Business agency for the City of Los Angeles.

We extended our commitment to our diverse community by contracting with Assistance League, Los Angeles, Court Referred Volunteer Center (CRVC) Program. The CRVC program provides Courts, Probation Departments, and Judicial Authorities community service/community labor options as an alternative to fines and incarcerations for adults and youth who are convicted of infractions, misdemeanors, or felonies. CRVC enables defendants to complete their community service sentences by matching them to nonprofit and government agencies with program needs. CRVC allows defendants to make restitution to the communities they have wronged, provides nonprofit agencies with volunteer labor, and instills in clients their civic responsibility, as well as a better understanding of the consequences of violating the law.

Our second greatest accomplishment was our amazing donors (See attached donors list)!!! Without your gracious donations of monetary, Christmas toys and gift cards, food, clothing, furniture for families and PPE supplies for both our staff and clientele, we could not have serviced as many families, as we did and continue to do throughout the year!!!

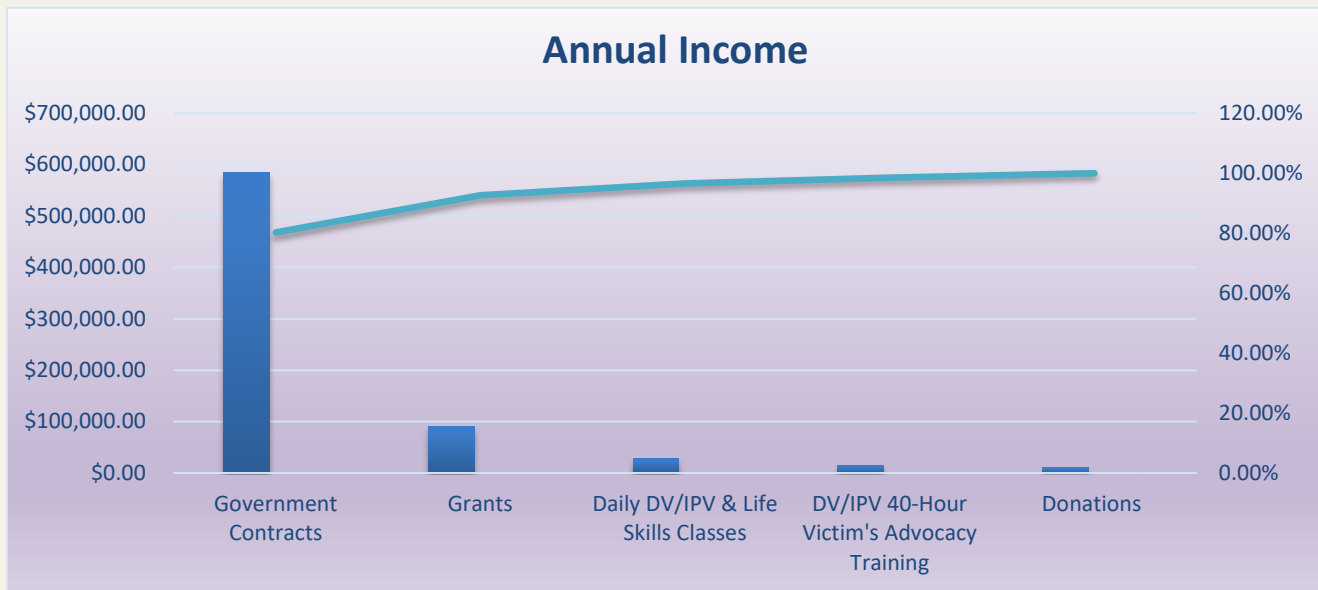
We are beyond blessed and humbled for everything our Lord and Savior does for us and the many avenues He provides to us for provision, protection and giving to others, daily!!!

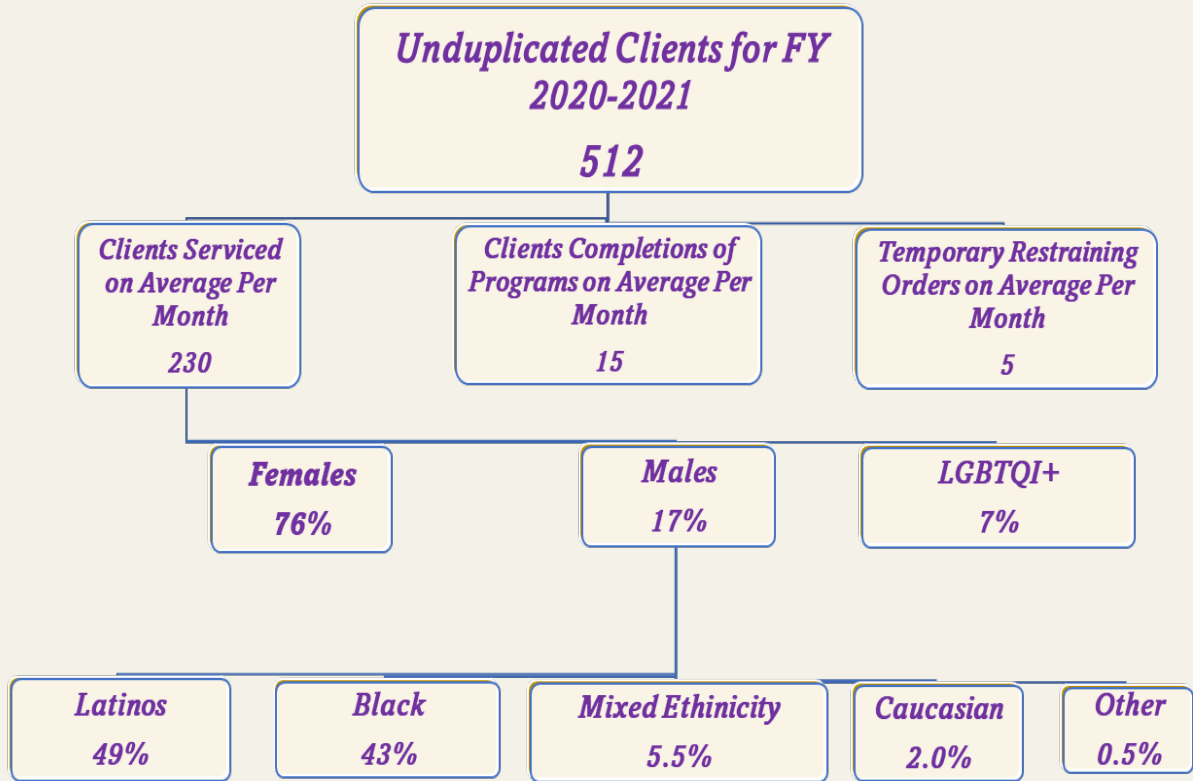
